Delegates Report September 8,2017 State Executive Committee Meeting

Meeting called to order about 6:00 PM at The Office of PLSO 150 East Wilson Bridge Road Suite 300 Worthington, Ohio 43085

It was determined that a quorum was present

Secretary's minutes for the July 2017 meeting were passed by a motion.

Treasurer report for July & August, 2017 was accepted for financial review.

Motions were passed to accept the membership of 7Professional, ! Associate, and 1 Student

CEAO: Candidates for Governor of State of Ohio spoke at the recent Meeting

ODOT: Ray Foos reported that he has been working on the model for the Low Distortion Project. He has revised his time frame and now expects to have the test sites determined by July of 2018 and implemented by the end of the year 2018. This is being developed for ODOT Use only at this point of time.

State Board: Bert Dawson's term is up for renewal. Bert is a licensed Surveyor and engineer.

The executive committee will send a letter in support of his reappointment.

This will be a renewal year for your surveyor's license. The State board advises that you do not check the box that says you have completed the required professional development hours if you have not done so when sending in your renewal, even if you intend to have them completed by years end. By checking this box and not yet having all your hours you will have committed a felony.

Standards: Brad Kramer reported that his committee will finish their review of the current standards and submit proposed changes to the State Board by end of 2018.

NSPS: Bob Akins reported that the small business administration held a roundtable plan in Cincinnati and Cleveland in August. Steve Cahill (Cin) and George Hofmann (Cleve) gave presentations regarding the Davis-Bacon Act where survey crew members are now considered labors and are subject to prevailing wages.


