Presidents Letter – PLSO Cleveland

In my last letter, published in the July issue of CSN, you may recall I told the story of how I discovered an irate neighbor had moved my capped pins for a survey we had done 4 years ago on West 7th Street in Cleveland's Tremont neighborhood. I also asked for any opinions / advice from those of you who read the story. Well I did get a response from one of our members. Rich Kole suggested that I contact the Board of Registration for guidance on how to proceed. Sounded like a good idea that I hadn't considered, so I did give them a call.

I was connected with Julie Clement, our board investigator, explained what I had discovered and asked her if I could just remove the now erroneous rear pins. I also explained that the new lot owner was not interested in paying for a re-survey and just wanted me to define the rear line with new offsets from the erroneous pins so he could put his fence up, which I did. I told her that Mr. Hickey, the new owner, had contacted the owner & threatened a lawsuit for any further incursions to which he replied that he knew nothing about it & it must have been his tenants. As Julie wasn't sure of the answer herself, she told me she'd pose the question to John Greenhalge & Jacin McLean who were currently out at a conference, and get back to me the next week. I sent her a copy of the July CSN that they could read themselves. Following is my e-mail to Julie & her reply:

Julie,

See President's Letter on pages 2-4. It explains the whole sequence of events, but was written to be entertaining to our members as well. As mentioned, Cleveland Police will just take it as a vandalism report & do nothing, & a lawsuit would go nowhere. The adjacent owner has already denied moving the property pins & blamed it on his tenants. My only question is should I remove the pins, or at least my caps, knowing that they're now incorrect.

I spoke with Director Greenhalge and Enforcement Supervisor McLean and they advised for you to contact your attorney first and make sure there are no laws that prevent you from pulling the pins. Our laws and rules would allow you to move the pins or remove them from an incorrect location that the neighbor placed them and reset the pins in the correct location you place them indicated on your plat. Let me know if you have any other questions.

SURVEYOR OF THE YEAR COMMITTEE SELECTION PROCEDURES

DRAFTED: NOVEMBER 30, 1999

AMMENDED: JANUARY 03, 2001

This fact sheet was drafted at the 1999 meeting of the Surveyor Of The Year Committee to clarify and state for the record certain issues and to promulgate a change to facilitate future Committee meetings.

- 1) The Surveyor Of The Year Committee shall be comprised of all previous recipients of the award. The Committee shall be chaired by the most immediate past recipient excluding the current holder.
- The procedure for Selection: The Committee Chair shall call for a meeting in October¹ of each year, at which time nominations shall be received and considered.

R

(A) Eligibility:

Each nominee² must be a Professional Surveyor in the State of Ohio and a member of The Cleveland Chapter of Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio³.

(B) Selection Criteria:

Nominees will be judged by the Committee on the basis of the nominee's technical and professional accomplishments; the nominee's current activities; the extent to which the nominee has given to the advancement of the profession; and the involvement in civic and community affairs.

(C) Procedure For Selection:

The Committee Chair shall call a meeting for nominations. It is suggested that the Chair mail a copy of the updated list of prior honorees, along with a copy of the selection criteria and copies of nominations to members of the Surveyor Of The Year Committee for review prior to the meeting.

(D) Committee Report:

The Surveyor Of The Year Committee shall notify the Chapter President of their decision. The announcement shall be made at the next general membership meeting. The award shall be presented at the annual meeting or as determined by the Chapter.

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
