_____ Meeting Highlights =

March 1st 2007 C.P.D. Seminar Report



In the field, Doug then sets up a local laser or G.P.S. base network for his control. Next, the electronic information is downloaded to various types of computer-controlled construction machinery, and sensors on the bulldozers calculate the position of Earthmovers the blades. automatically adjust to cut or fill to the programmed elevations. Currently, earthwork/mass-grading and subgrade trimming are the most common applications; however, finished concrete work (with much tighter tolerances) is only a few years away. Doug remarked that his 20+ years of experience dictate that all the cuts be continuously checked with traditional surveying methods !

In his opinion, these industry trends toward computer-controlled equipment, automatic vertical laser control, and robots "talking to each other" will mean more work for highly skilled flesh-and-blood surveyors today and in the future.

Twenty-three of our members glimpsed into the future of construction staking at the first seminar of the year. Doug Fleming, P.S., the Chief Surveyor of Anthony Allega Cement Contractor, showed us examples of three-dimensional modeling of actual construction projects at Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, Interstate 90 in Lake County, and a new subdivision street in Independence.

Doug explained that his first step is to request electronic AutoCad files from the engineer

(sometimes paying him a fee). Next, he uses TerraModel software from Trimble and inputs additional spot elevations, thus creating a specialized three-dimensional representation of the surface to be staked. These 3-D files are similar to the T.I.N. networks that AutoCad uses to create contour maps.




As usual, all those who attended received a 1 hour C.P.D. certificate from the Cleveland P.L.S.O.





Highlights:

John Hoy asked for each executive committee officer to submit an article/message for each newsletter.

This year's picnic was announced to be held at Albion Woods picnic area on August 9.

The chapter's website is being updated and the executive committee will be able to test and critique the site for content and functionality.

Tom Snezek reported only 1 Education Survey had been returned that was given out at the March 1 seminar meeting. He asked for more to be returned, so please bring it with you filled out to the April seminar meeting. Tom also reported that Neil Juhnke is now working as the Tax Map Surveyor in the county Tax Map Department.

John Dailey is still trying to get the Cuyahoga County Archives to officially take the chapter's Data Bank.

A draft letter to welcome new chapter members was presented and discussed. A letter will be part of a welcoming package the chapter is organizing to be sent to new members.

A number of years ago, the Cleveland Chapter came into possession of the Data Bank. This started with a title company buying the assets of National Surveys Company. The title company

did not want to keep or maintain the records of National Surveys, so they were going to dispose of them. Carl Craddock felt that this would be a big loss, so he approached the Cleveland Chapter about purchasing the old records. The title company was willing to sell the Chapter the records for the scrap cost of the filing cabinets. A deal was struck and the Data Bank came to the Cleveland Chapter. Since then, a couple of other retiring surveyors or their families have donated records to the Bank.



Over the years, it has been housed in several locations: the County Engineer's Bridge Garage, a self storage unit and lately at the offices of Garrett and Associates. At the end of last year, Garrett and Associates was sold to The Courtney Company and Courtney is going to relocate the newly acquired Garrett operations to their new building.

After some discussion at the Chapter Executive Committee, it was decided to offer the Data Bank to the Cuyahoga County Archives. This would finally give the Data Bank a permanent home and a place where it would be maintained. Since I volunteer at the Archives, I was asked to make the offer.

President John Bischof, Jack Hoy and I met with County Archivist Dr. Judith Cetina and her immediate supervisor, John Myers. We viewed the Data Bank at Garrett's office, assessed the space needed and the possible impact and use of the Data Bank on the Archives. All felt that this would be the best possible home for these records.

A final decision was given today and we were told that the Data Bank would be accepted by the County Archives. They finally have a home.

It was also decided that the Chapter would cull the files one last time, remove any extraneous data and prepare the Data Bank for moving. This will include numbering the cabinets and files so that they can be placed in the proper order at the Archives. When this is done, the County will provide the manpower for the move.

The Archives are located at 2905 Franklin Avenue, Cleveland, and will be open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:30 A.M. until 3:30 P.M., except for legal holidays. There is copying equipment available on site since no records may be removed from the Archives.

Also at the Archives are the old (pre 1947) tax maps, the recorded plat books from Volume 1 to about 177, a lot of the old deed index books, some of the older deed books and a lot of records from the County Engineer's office. With the addition of the Data Bank, there will be a lot of property data available in one central location, not only for surveyors, but for genealogists and historical researchers.

I believe the people who have worked so hard on this Data Bank, such a Carl Craddock, the late Mike Papcum, two County Engineers and the people who have moved the Bank four times deserve our heartfelt thanks. Without them, this information could have been in the recycling bin years ago. We should also thank Richard Garrett for making space available at his office for Data Bank for the past few years and we should also express our thanks to the Courtney Company for offering to continue to house it.

Delegate's Report

Meeting - Friday, March 2, 2007

5.1 - New Members - motion was passed to accept three new professionals, two affiliates, five students and thirteen reinstated members. Motion was passed to accepted one sustaining member.

5.4 - National Surveyors Museum - motion to donate \$1,000.00 to the National Surveyor's Museum in Springfield, Illinois was passed.

5.5 - Soil Scientist - motion was passed to allow President Kramer to send a letter to the Association of Ohio Pedologists (APO). The letter is to let the APO know that although professional surveyors are not permitted to analyze soil to determine what

type of sewage treatment system to use on a site. Only a professional surveyor is licensed to provide a topographic survey for a site. PLSO would like both groups to work together.

7.12 - Standards Committee - on February 10, 2007 NGS finalized the new National Re adjustment. This is a unified adjustment as opposed to the individual state HARN adjustments, which were separate adjustments often completed during different years. This latest adjustment is based on high accuracy GPS-derived observations and does not incorporate the original "traditional" survey observations such as triangulation and trilateration. The name chosen by NGS for the adjustment is NAD83 (NSRS 2007) - (National Spatial Reference System). NGS expects the data to be available on data sheets by the end of March.

7.14 - State Line Committee - Dean Ringle no reports - Paul Dinam suggested donations to cover supply costs.

7.20 - Newsletter Editor - cut-off date of March 15 for second issue. Looking for articles from members - reports from chapters.

7.3 - NSPS Governor - asked for issues from PLSO to report to NSPS. NSPS is looking for merit badge counselor volunteers. Information available on NSPS website.

7.43 - Summer Seminar - 2007 Summer will be hosted by the Firelands Chapter (Phil Rosebeck) at the Kalahari Resort in Sandusky.

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
