Now is the time to cling to our high professional ethics and moral standards in the face of greed and selfishness all around us. The news has been full of reports of corruption: Local real estate title company executives convicted of fraud, County officials and contractors raided by the F.B.I., unscrupulous mortgage lenders, etc. Our professionalism will set us apart from the crowd.

Recently PLSO has formally objected to proposed Ohio Dept. of Insurance Rule changes which regulate Title Insurers. The proposed Rule change concerns the substitution of G.I.S. maps for a current survey (Mortgage Location Survey or A.L.T.A. Survey)! At this time, PLSO does not know if the rule changes are likely to be adopted. As with all regulatory issues, it behooves us surveyors to pepper our elected representatives and state officials with letters, phone calls, and emails. Regardless, it's a good idea to start a rapport with those folks. For more specifics, or to obtain a copy of PLSO's formal complaint, contact Terry Feller at McSteen Associates.



Our own State Board of Registration for Engineers & Surveyors has proposed seventeen minor changes to Chapter 4733 of the State Administrative Code. Of interest are formal specifications for electronic seals which are now permitted: "unique computer-generated seal, electronic signature and date" must be "linked to a document in such a manner that the electronic signature is invalidated if any data in the document are changed". Under the heading of Improper Conduct, the proposed requirement will specify that sealing work prepared under his/her supervision and direction requires that "the engineer or surveyor should be involved from the project's inception to its completion and closely involved in the preparation of the work product". Also, there are many new stipulations to the requirements for an application to sit for the Principles & Practice Exam. Under the heading of Solicitation of Employment, the proposed change will delete the current reference that, "the engineer or surveyor may submit proposed fee information prior to selection."

#### Random Lines

You may have noticed that my column, "Sightlines" was missing from the latest issue of the Ohio Surveying News. This was not an accident, it was intentional.

I have made a decision that I will not write for the OSN until such time that some serious changes are made and the publication gets back on a reasonable schedule. There were supposed to be five issues last year, there were three, the first arriving in May. So far this year, we have received two, the second arriving on August first. By the time OSN arrives, everything in it is stale. The Editor of OSN has tendered his resignation and now, six month later, his replacement has not been named. Don Friemoth wants out and the "leadership" dallies.

In the mean time, PLSO flounders without an Executive Director. The current officers are trying to take up the slack, but a full time director, with the authority to hire and

fire staff, is needed to control and direct the office staff. To call a spade a spade, the office staff needs someone to direct them and to set priorities. We now have close to a rudderless ship. There is a "search committee" theoretically looking for a new Executive Director that has not done its job. PLSO, instead of moving forward for the betterment of our profession and our society, is standing still.

The elected officers and the Executive Committee have been paralyzed by the removal of the former Executive Director and the possibility of legal action, all to the detriment of the Ohio surveyors and our association. The only thing that has galvanized the membership recently was the proposed changes to the OAC by the State Insurance Board. When that information was transmitted to some of the membership, it at least generated some interest.

The elected officers and the Executive Committee must lead. Decisions have to be made. Directions must be given. Caution is sometimes not the best route. Hopefully, a new Executive Director will be hired and a new Editor appointed and the State Executive Committee will start acting like leaders.

Executive Committee Meeting on Friday, July 11, 2008

Call to order: 6:03 p.m.

Upon completion of a roll call, determination of a quorum, acceptance of the January minutes and Treasurers report the meeting turned to **Unfinished** Business.

- 4.1 The Executive Director situation: The investigator for the Ohio Civil Rights Commission completed and submitted the report. In just the last 24 hours we've heard that the case was closed. A final report from our attorney should indicate that the claim was dismissed.
  - Monumentation of Railroads: NSPS has documentation which should help with proposed legislation efforts.



Delegate

- Motion was passed to move the September meeting from the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 19<sup>th</sup> 4.6 because of a conflict with the Surveyor's Historical Society's Rendezvous.
- Website Upgrade: Testing of the new website is well underway and membership lists are 4.7 being added. Good chance that it could be ready by the end of the first week of August.

#### **New Business**

Acceptance of new members. Mathew C. Neff was added to the Cleveland Chapter. 5.1 It was decided that it is not a good time to accept the proposal from Jeff Lucas for the State Specific Case Law Book.

ODOT is looking into standards for DTM's.

The State Board is conducting its five year review for possible changes to 4733 which it will propose to the legislature.



- 7.1 Political Action Committee: Balance in the fund of \$1,484.85 has not changed.
- 7.14 PLSO Vision Committee: Rose Coors reported that the committee met early in June and that for now the Chair is Rusty Rosebeck.
- 7.15 Executive Director Search Committee: No progress, no report. Paul Dinan said he has not pressed the committee to get started.
   Newsletter Editor Report: Issue 2 being printed. Deadline for Issue 3 is August 1, 2008.
- 7.3 The NSPS Governor was absent from our meeting at a re-enactment in Steubenville. A commendation was received from the State Legislature for our TrigStar winner.
  - 7.41 The Program Committee is met at 4:00 p.m. today and reviewed the planning and status of the conference and seminars through 2011.
  - 7.42 Membership Committee: Bob Akins has made no progress on the new member brochure.

Please note its disclaimer for data completeness and accuracy that all county GIS websites have. Also note the GIS is still under final testing which may be an additional reason for caution to not rely on it for important items without verification.

The GIS includes new color aerial photography that was flown in 2006. You'll notice that "Aerial 2008" and the "Oblique Aerial" text is greyed out under the "Base Maps" pull-down. The word is that new aerial photography from May of this year will also be available for viewing later this year. The oblique aerials should be similar to the "birds eye" view available from <a href="http://maps.live.com">http://maps.live.com</a>
