


= Seminar Meeting Highlights =

November 2, 2006

Our last Seminar Meeting of 2006 was a panel presentation. The evening was fairly evenly split amongst the three speakers: John Matricardi, P.E. of Matrix Engineering, Mark Yeager, P.S. of KS Associates, Inc. and Peter D. Zwick, P.S., P.E. of Zwick Associates, Inc.

John Matricardi explained the procedures for creating an ODNR Submerged Land Lease. He covered forms for permits and lease applications, guidelines for preliminary lease descriptions and plats, Ohio Revised Code concerning leases and rental rates, procedures for preparing ODNR submerged land leases and provided a sample land lease plat and description. His presentation was very informative. He mentioned that there are several lawsuits concerning submerged land leases which may have an affect on these procedures but that there are currently over 800 such leases and around 2000 other land owners who should have them. Mark Yeager reviewed the 2005 revision to the ALTA / ACSM Land Title Survey Specifications. Mark detailed changes and the reason changes were made, most often to protect liability of the surveyor



concerning areas outside the expertise of the profession. One important point everyone took from his presentation: any change to the language of the standard certification and the survey can no longer be titled an ALTA / ACSM Land Title Survey. (Both ALTA and NSPS agree on that point)

Peter Zwick outlined the changes to Ohio Condominium laws as they pertain to surveying. Particular items include revised definition of terms and requirements for certifications.

The new Seminar Meeting format has proven to be very successful. This meeting experienced a 60% increase in attendance, a total of 44. The hotel easily accommodated the change, added additional staff and the meeting ran smoothly and on time. Although our Chapter boundaries



are Lorain and Cuyahoga counties, we had attendees from Geauga, Lake, Medina, Sandusky and Summit.

The next subscription of Seminar Meetings begins in March. Registration will be in February. The March 1, 2007 speaker is Doug Fleming, P.S. the Chief Surveyor of Allega Cement Contractors. His topic: "Today's Computer Applications in the Construction Industry" including stakeout from 3D model files.

2007 Cleveland Chapter Surveyor of the Year Neil Juhnke, P.S.

Neil was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio and is a 1980 graduate of Charles F. Brush High School. He obtained an Associates Degree in Electronics from Cuyahoga County Community College in 1984. During which time and for a couple of year after graduating, he worked for Ralph C. Tyler Company as a draftsman, which introduced him to the field of Civil Engineering and Surveying.

In 1986 Neil began his current career with the County Engineer's office by taking a drafting position with the Tax Map Department. There he further developed his knowledge of mapping, deed research and surveying principals. He also was at the forefront of the development and conversion of the mapping from hand-drawn to digital environments.

Moving to the Survey Department in 1988, he was able to expand his knowledge of Surveying by working on the development and review of the Right-of-Way plans for various Highway and Bridge Projects

- \$1,000 was approved to support the Akron students in the "Railroad Surveying" ACSM competition.


- Indiana State Line retracement is scheduled for the spring.

- Paul Dinan is requesting every chapter to have a Trig-Star representative and program.
- There will be no December State Executive Committee Meeting.
- NSPS has raised half of the necessary funds to produce a safety video. \$1,000 was approved to donate to this project.
- The PLSO Business Seminar in October at the Quest Conference Center was a failure. Attendance was expected to be three hundred and guarantees were made based on that figure. Registration as of October 10th was only twenty six. Cancellation, per contract, was \$24,000.00. Actual attendance was only forty six. The loss was over \$27,000.00 and subsequently renegotiated to \$10,000.00.

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





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ODOT CORS VRS: A brief update


The Ohio Department of Transportation's Continuinally Operating Reference Station network operated by the Department of Aerial Engineering, has network coverage gaps around the border of Ohio. Positions outside the triangulation network are subject to larger and unpredictable residual errors. ODOT's current network leaves the northern half of both counties in our Chapter, Cuyahoga and Lorain, outside of their network as shown in the image to the right.





In the past few months the National Geodetic Survey has added CORS sites to their database of downloadable CORS sites at Marblehead Island (OHMH) and at Gordon Park in Cleveland (OHCD) as shown as the red circle stations. (left)

These two locations are in very advantageous positions for ODOT VRS users in Cuyahoga and Lorain counties. If these two sites were added to the ODOT CORS network, it would resemble the image on the right. The thicker green lines would be the new network coverage area completely encompassing our two counties.



I inquired about these stations being added to ODOT's VRS network with David Albrecht, Survey Operations Manager of ODOT's Office of Aerial Engineering. David stated that NGS does not object to ODOT linking their data into the VRS system, but these two stations are tied to only 56k data transmission lines that are too slow to be integrated.
