When you print a document from the Lorain County Recorder's website, www.loraincounty.com/ recorder/, a grey "UNOFFICIAL" watermark appears behind the text of the document. Interestingly, no "UNOFFICIAL" text shows up if you save the document to your computer.

Thanks goes to Past President <u>Peter D. Zwick</u> for helping their recorder understand the need for the stamp/watermark modification. This is <u>PLSO</u> working for you!









A Standardized File everyone can utilize

Geographic data and the technology used to view that data is evolving and is becoming standardized to accommodate the masses. Technology is almost surpassing our ability to keep up with all of the data formats, desktop software versions and mobile applications. The data formats available for displaying geographic data are quickly expanding every day. It is not uncommon for one office to use a variety of file formats for displaying geographic data. The file format used most often depends on many variables such as, who will be viewing the data, the accuracy of the data or base map on which it will be displayed, software and hardware specifications and the knowledge base of the person using the data.

One format that continues to grow in popularity for viewing geographic data is the KML (.kml) file. KML stands for Keyhole Markup Language. KML is a file format used to display geographic data in an earth-browser such as Google Earth, Google Maps and

Google maps for mobile. KML is based on the XML standard. XML stands for extensive markup language. XML is the World Wide Web Consortium's (W3C) recommended standard for creating formats & sharing data on the web. For more information about W3C, visit www.w3.org XML's design goals emphasize simplicity,

generality, and usability over the Internet. A KML file is simply a small text file with instructions for Google Earth to interpret. KML consists of tags, symbology and attribute information. If you are completely new to KML, you can begin by authoring your own KML documents using Google Earth. Google Earth will allow you to "Add" a place marks, patches, and polygons.

One way to begin using this data format may be to "Add" all of your clients to Google Earth or all of the locations of the surveys you completed in the last

year. By creating this user friendly KML file, you can begin to see spatial relationships and other valuable information about your geographic data. Using such programs as Google Earth, users have the option to query a location by address or by Latitude and Longitude.

Still, there has been a great deal of discussion in the circles of GIS professionals and neogeographers alike on whether the use of this type of data and earth-viewers is really GIS. But one can say without question, applications such as Google Earth are being used extensively. KML formats are appearing on local government data download sites, next to other native GIS file formats such as the Shape File (.shp). Learning more about KML and how to use these files can open up new and efficient ways to view, share and distribute geographic data very quickly. Today, CAD and GIS programs have built in utilities for converting various file formats to KML. KML is also widely accepted in enterprise GIS solutions such as ESRI's ArcGIS Server. Dynamic KML can be

published as services and shared by large audiences in an enterprise GIS system.

A recent iPhone application, available through the iPhone App Store, allows users to collect geographic data and export as a KMZ file, which is a compressed file for a collection of KML files. Using this application, field staff can collect information about points, add photos and even voice notes. This is just one example of how technology is adapting and evolving to widely used platforms that have the ability to export to common data formats, which can be viewed on a variety of software platforms. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), National Geodetic Society (NGS) and Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) have served data in KML format. The future is definitely bright for geographic data interoperability and ease of use on standardized software and hardware platforms.





The conference room layout is shown above and is all conveniently on the same floor, except the amphitheater by nature extends to two floors. The amphitheater has state-of-the-art A/V features and seats 500, which will be used to hold *everyone* for the keynote speech which will open the event Thursday morning. The divider will be installed later that morning and our two main sessions will use both halves of the room.

The InterContinental hotel is attached to the Cleveland Clinic. And just like the Clinic, the hotel's walls are filled with gallery quality local art. You could spend a couple hours walking through the hotel admiring the work of local artists, compare that to most hotels that contain more wall decorations than art.


