

Random Lines by John Dailey, P.S.

How about a little history?

Everyone in the Greater Cleveland Area knows where Riverside Cemetery is but very few know much about it. Let me tell you what I discovered. The Connecticut Land Company held title to the lands west of the Cuyahoga River after 1795 but the occupation of that land was held by Indian tribes. It was not until 1805 that those claims were settled.

James and Mary Fish of Groton, Connecticut, were the first purchasers of land in Range 13, Township 7 in the Connecticut Western Reserve in the wild west territory of Ohio which eventually became Brooklyn Township. They were the first "legal" and permanent settlers west of the Cuyahoga River. In the Spring of 1812 they moved to the west bank. Isaiah Fish was born 1814 making him the first white child born west of the Cuyahoga River in the Western Reserve.

The Fish family's found a neighbor, a Canadian squatter named Granger (remember that name) who was already living on a magnificent hillside with a great view of the Cuyahoga River valley. With the arrival of the Fish family, Granger and his two sons apparently felt they were being squeezed by civilization and by all the newcomers, so they sold their improvements and moved further west to the Maumee country. The site of Granger's cabin was, and is now known as Granger Hill. This is not to be confused with the Granger Road Hill in Valley View and Garfield Heights. That one was named for John Granger of Independence Township and is now part of Garfield Heights and Valley View.

Fish had other neighbors, not near as friendly as Granger. It seems that the west bank of the Cuyahoga River was infested with rattlesnakes. After his first encounter with them, he stated "What a smart idea it was for God Almighty to put bells on them things!" They were a constant threat, sometimes crawling up through the openings in his cabin floor. Fish became known as an expert rattlesnake hunter.

Granger Hill was part of the land which eventually became Riverside Cemetery. What started out as 102 acres has been trimmed down to its present 90 acres by Interstate highways, land sales and other developments. Riverside Cemetery was founded in

1874 in response to Lake View Cemetery on the East side. The west side elite wanted a high quality cemetery of their own and they got it.

As Paul Harvey always said, "and now the rest of the story."

A Sauk Indian by the name of Ma-ka-tai-me-she-kia-kiak (which translates to "Black

Sparrow Hawk" or Black Hawk) was born in 1767 in the large Sauk village near what is now the city of Rock Island, Illinois. He grew up in this hunting and trading village and came to hate the Americans after he heard of the American purchase of the Louisiana Territory. In 1804, a treaty was negotiated in which the Sauk and Fox Indians ceded about 15 million acres of land east of the Mississippi River to the United States. This infuriated Black Hawk. During the War of 1812, Black Hawk, as war chief, sided with the British and fought at the side of Tecumseh. After the war, Black Hawk signed a document confirming the Treaty of 1804. Later, he recanted and said he was ignorant of what the document said. In 1831, the Sauk returned to the Illinois country to reclaim their ancestral lands and this is what precipitated the "Black Hawk War."

The Illinois Governor requested Federal troops and called out the Illinois Militia to meet this threat. Black Hawk withdrew back across the Mississippi and rethought his plans. In 1832, with between 400 and 500 warriors and their families, he re-crossed the Mississippi to fight for their lands. He believed that he would receive assistance from Canada and other Indian tribes. He was wrong.


Black Hawk sent a delegation to speak to the Americans, but some of the Illinois militiamen killed two of the representatives. Black Hawk and his warriors headed back west across the Mississippi to end the fighting. They were attacked by the army and militia at the mouth of the Bad Axe River in Wisconsin, defeated and captured. In the peace treaty, the Sauk had to cede more of their land in return for an annuity and a reservation in Iowa.

This Black Hawk War brought together, as allies, two military officers who would meet again under far different circumstances. One was an Illinois Militia lieutenant named Abraham Lincoln and the other was a (Cont'd on Page 9)

West Point graduate named Jef- (Cont'd from Page 7) ferson Davis. Remember, the Civil War was still 28 years in the future.

In 1833, Black Hawk was taken east to meet with President Andrew Jackson and was imprisoned for a while at Fortress Monroe, Virginia. Black Hawk was sent back west under armed guard, passing along the south shore of Lake Erie. He asked to stop for a while in Cleveland in order to visit his mother's grave. He was given a canoe or small boat, paddled a couple of miles up the Cuyahoga River to a bluff on the west side of the river, where he stopped and paid his respects to his mother. The bluff is believed to be Granger Hill, now part of Riverside Cemetery. He returned to the mouth of the Cuyahoga River with tears in his eyes and continued his trip westward. He had lost control of the Sauk Tribe to a younger chief and died in Iowa in 1838.

Now that is the rest of the story.... or is it? There is a question in all this. If he was born in the Illinois country, why was his mother buried in the Cleveland area? As in almost any research, some information always raises more questions.

Executive Committee Meeting - Friday April 9, 2011, 6:05 P.M.

- 1.2 No visitors or guests
- 1.3 Two alternate delegates seated
- 1.4 Quorum Established
- 1.5 One Agenda item added, (see 5.2 on Ethic issue)
- 2.0 Secretary's minutes From March meeting were accepted with minor revisions

3.0 Treasurer's Report - Report for March was reviewed with some discussion about the low return on the saving account. It was determined the state of the economy was the cause. Report accepted pending review of the Finance Committee.

Unfinished Business:

4.1 Director Gilpin reviewed the Social Media proposal for the State's website. "Marcy Designs" who did their original webpage was discussed, (see proposal attached). Initial cost would be \$750 to set-up and \$200 per month to maintain until the end of the current fiscal year (ending June). Motion passed to allow up to \$1400 to be draw from line item #3300 on the budget.

4.2 Director Gilpin said the Statute of Limitation bill was tabled by Senator Sites who has lost his seat as the committee chair. Discussion on when the four-year window would begin: The Recording date? The invoice date? The date the pins were set?

5.1 Bob Akins reported no new members.

5.2 President-Elect Dana Parsell discussed an issue regarding a potential ethic concern for our membership. The issue revolves around an alleged altering of topographic spot elevations on a surveyors map to get Board of Health and municipal approvals. The complaint was brought by the neighbor who happens to be a surveyor. The surveyor of records made no complaint. The State Board reviewed and dismissed the case in 2009. Mr. Parsell was presenting the issue in behalf of the neighbor surveyor, a Mr. Larry Askins. Mr. Askins was asking for the P.L.S.O. to take up the cause. It was discussed and determined that since we no longer have a "Professional Practices Committee", which was disbanded in 1985, we would not get involved.


