Land Surveying and PLSO Membership

Our chapter membership is now down under 110, the lowest it's been in probably decades. I've heard hearsay of those that think PLSO is too expensive and they don't get anything for membership. If you think the cost of membership is too high, your professional services rates might be too low, and the are low compared to other professions. It should be a business cost, budgeted for. If you are a Professional Surveyor in Ohio and not a PLSO member, you are benefiting from PLSO's efforts. This past year PLSO help defend GPS signal frequencies from a cell phone company that wanted to greatly disrupt the quality of signal reception, and prevented Ohio laws from being passed in such a state that they infringed on or damaged Professional Surveying. Say "thank you" to PLSO. Consider membership in PLSO like having preventative maintenance performed on your car. Sure you could just drive a new car for 30,000 miles and only putting gas in the tank and air in the tires, but sooner or later you're going to have a major breakdown on your car. Same goes with your profession.

Now a little on Professional Surveying. Recently I heard of a college graduated surveyor who was on his way to obtaining his surveying license, but has left surveying. Why? He didn't like being a "button pusher" in the field and felt he had no room for growth or advancement at his place of employment. Wow! I was fortunate enough to work under a Surveyor, after I graduated from college, that understood that in order for workers to be fulfilled, happy, and be productive they need a path of learning, growth, and advancement. And at the 2012 PLSO Annual Conference, a session included results of a survey that employers and employees took about what was important to the employee. Basically what was important to the employee was the opposite that the employer thought was important to the employee. Employees want to be informed and "in on things" and feel that their efforts and opinions matter. And remember from Jim Smith "the happiness coach" a happy worker is a productive worker and is also a safer worker! So consider finding new things that your field technician can do beyond entering topo point codes into the data collector.

2013 Surveyor of the Year

Peter D. Zwick, P.S., P.E.

Mr. Zwick will be honored at our Annual Meeting on January 24th. Come congratulate him and swap surveying stories with him!

Peter first learned about the land surveying profession from his father, Peter C. Zwick, P.E., P.S., who originally hired him as an assistant chainman. About twenty-five years ago, the younger Peter joined the PLSO and enrolled in the Cleveland Chapter's Survey Education Course.



Now president of Zwick Engineering, Peter often surveys land in connection with new construction projects, both public and private. "I like to visit the site before construction, take in the lay of the land, and then visualize what will be constructed (like using a time-travel machine)." He also testifies in legal disputes as an expert witness in regard to engineering and land surveying issues, striving to articulate technical information in an easily understandable manner. Peter's business and professional philosophy is that, "It really pays to be thorough in the first place, because this heads off having to go back later to rework something."

Peter and his wife, Anne, reside in the wilds of Columbia Station. Lately, they are busy with preparing to send their youngest of four sons off to engineering school next year. Fiscal Year shall be July 1 through June 30. Chapter year shall be from one Annual Meeting to the next Annual Meeting (January to January).




Cleveland Chapter's Delegate Report

Friday January 11, 2013

- −5 Officers and 15 Delegates, Quorum Established.
- January Minutes reviewed, accepted with minor changes.
- Treasurer's Report Reviewed November 2012 and December 2012
 Treasurer's Reports. All were accepted subject to the Finance Committee's review, as per the Charter guidelines.





- C.E.A.O. 11 of the returning 88 County Engineers are new.
- O.D.O.T. New O.D.O.T. specification book is out. All surveying related issues from section 823 are now in Section 623.
- State Board of Registration Bill to allow PS exams to be done on line by 2014 is moving through the House of Representatives.
- OGRIP Dean Ringle reported on efforts to dispose of State owned lands and efforts to standardize parcel continuity across the state.

Committee Reports

- Political Action Current Balance \$2604.35
- State line surveys planning begun to perform monument repairs on all three lines this season.
- Historic Review The Lincoln National Surveying Museum in Springfield, Ill., has officially closed. Jim Williams' new book on Ohio Surveying will be premiered on April 5 at a conference in Marietta.
- Ohio Surveying News is at the printer's and should be out the week of 1/14/13.
- N.S.P.S. Governor Reported on efforts of Membership committee to review the M.O.U. received from the N.S.P.S. to offer full membership to any Professional Surveyor who is a member of a state organization for \$40.00 per year. Future reports will follow and an open discussion is suggested by each chapter and opinions and views on this issue are welcomed. At least four other state associations have already signed on.
- Trig Star is set up and ready for any chapter that may wish to sponsor a test. Contact Melinda Gilpin for more information.
- Annual Conferences -
 - -2013 is set and ready to go in Sharonsville, Ohio. By the way there is a water park available to bring the whole family.
 - 2014 right here in Cleveland's InterContinental Hotel is coming along fine. A Program Chair is still needed. Look for increased activity right after this year's conference.
- Legislation SB 354, the "Call Before you Dig" bill is now law and has been signed by the Governor. It attempts to create a One-stop-shop for all calls and hopefully speed up the process and bring a little more respect to the request by surveyors. 
