

2014 Surveyor of the Year

Robert G. Hoy, PS

Mr. Hoy will be honored at our Annual Meeting on January 23rd.

Robert started in land surveying during the summer of 1989 with John R. Hoy & Associates and continued working summers at various surveying companies through college. He graduated in 1996 from The Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Science in Land Surveying. While attending college he joined the PLSO in 1992 and served as the Student Chapter at OSU's president in 1995.



Now Mr. Hoy is Survey Manager for the Cleveland-Akron, Ohio offices of ARCADIS U.S., Inc. where he is also responsible for professional land surveying for all Ohio ARCADIS offices. His career has taken him from Georgia to Maryland, from 70 feet above the ground on crane rails in steel plants to staking borings in Lake Erie. In 1996 Robert started robotic total station surveying with his still favorite instrument and data collector software the Geodimeter 600.

When asked, what has Robert learned over the years? "How to work safely in the field, it's serious stuff! And to be open minded considering any likely possibility because no survey or Surveyor is perfect".

He has served the following offices for the Cleveland Chapter: Secretary 1997, '98, '07; Trustee 2003, '04, '08-'11 (CSN '08-'13), Delegate 2005, President 2012-2013. In addition to those position he has taught the chapter's Surveying Technician class, provided photography to the CSN since 2004 as well as numerous articles, editorials, and reviews for the CSN, and served on the committee for the 2004, 2008, and 2011 PLSO Annual Conferences. Robert is the only member to serve as President more than one term since William Haas in 1974.

Robert lives in Parma and enjoys golf, the outdoors, and photography in his spare time. In 2008 he started Photography by Hoy with his brother and Chapter Past-President John Hoy selling photographic prints at local art shows as well as on www.photographybyhoy.com

- -Law update. By motion and vote the new By-Laws were adopted.
- N.S.P.S. Governor Robert Akins reported on his recent trip to the Capital and the meetings held.
 Highlights are as follows;
 - Bob had a one-on-one meeting with Senator Brown, and with the staff of Senator Portman.
 - In the NSPS Meeting discussions included the possible loss of exemption from the Davis-Bacon Act for Surveying firms, Railroad Monumentation issues and Collective Mapping issues.
 - In the Membership Meeting discussions included that there are 40 states already included in the NSPS membership plan with 4 more pending. Surveyors may be able to receive special consideration from insurance companies with membership. They are considering establishing an "ALTA Certification Class" and "Drone Mapping" and any associated overlap with surveying is being reviewed.
 - Motion to give NSPS one more \$1500 donation for Sustain Membership was discussed. It passed
 with one Nay vote. Starting in July the P.L.S.O. will be supporting NSPS through the \$40 Membership
 dues.
 - Motion passed to approve a not to exceed amount of \$1500 to Governor Akins to attend the NSPS meeting in San Diego in March.
 - It is noted that the NSPS "Area Directors" positions will disappear at the end of each of their terms. This be replaced by representation by each member state and their governors.

Program

The Annual Conference in Sandusky at the Kalahari Resort and Conference Center hosted by our chapter is receiving active registration and interest is high. It was reported that registration is filling up fast and one should not delay! 

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD RULES AND QUALIFICATIONS

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this scholarship is to honor and promote those students seeking a career in surveying who will support and represent Ohio and the Surveying Profession in the future.

GENERAL:

The Cleveland Chapter of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio, Inc. (PLSO) may present, annually, scholarship award(s) to be used for tuition expenses of students qualified as described below. Scholarship(s) will be available to students preparing for either their final year of a Surveying Degree/Certificate Program at an Associate of Applied Science level or their Junior or Senior year of a Surveying or Geomatics Program at a four year Bachelor of Science level.

ELIGIBILITY:

- 1. The student must be enrolled in a Surveying-related Degree/Certificate Program at a state accredited college or university.
- 2. It is preferred but not required that the student reside or work within the boundaries of the Cleveland Chapter of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio, which includes the counties of Cuyahoga and Lorain.
- 3. The student must be prepared for, and these monies used in, their final year of a two year Surveying Degree/Certificate Program at an Associate of Applied Science level; or the Junior or Senior year of a Surveying or Geomatics Program at a four year Bachelor of Science level.
- 4. The student must have an accumulated grade point average of 2.5 or above (based on a 4.0 system). Sealed Transcripts must be included with application.
- 5. The student must provide 2 (two) recommendations for this award:
 - A. A faculty member within the surveying department of the student's school which includes verification that the student is in good standing with the program
 - B. A member of PLSO not affiliated with the college or university in which the applicant is enrolled.
- 6. Part-time Students: Scholarship award shall be determined by the ratio of hours enrolled to the minimum hours required for full-time status, as defined by the college or university.
- 7. The student should show a continued drive to become a practicing surveyor and exhibit those qualities which are essential in becoming a professional person.
- 8. The student is encouraged to be a participating Student Member of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio, Inc. Membership applications are available at www.ohiosurveyor.org
- 9. The minimum amount of each Scholarship, if awarded, shall be \$500.00.
- 10. The scholarship monies as determined annually by the Executive Committee may or may not be awarded.
- 11. No student may receive more than two (2) Cleveland Chapter PLSO scholarships.

STUDENT APPLICATION:

A student may inquire as to the procedure involved in applying for this scholarship through his/her faculty advisor or through the Cleveland Chapter of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio. Completed application forms and other requested materials shall be submitted to the Cleveland Chapter PLSO Scholarship Committee by March 1 of each year. Application forms will be made available from the Cleveland Chapter of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio or through the Surveying Department of their school. A student who has applied and been rejected for the State PLSO Annual Memorial Scholarship may request to be considered for the Cleveland Chapter PLSO scholarship award through the recommendation of the State PLSO Scholarship Committee without further application.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

The Cleveland Chapter of the Professional Land Surveyors of Ohio Scholarship Committee will conform to the Chapter By-Laws. The Scholarship Committee will be responsible for reviewing and verifying the recommendations and the applications submitted by the students seeking this scholarship and to make the final recommendations to the Executive Committee.

AWARD:

At the Cleveland Chapter's May Executive Committee meeting, the Scholarship Committee shall present the names of the students recommended for the award(s) to the Executive Committee of the chapter for final approval. The recognition of the award(s) will then be announced immediately thereafter. These scholarships shall be paid directly to the school in the name of the student by August 10.
