



President's Message

Field Safety

Safety again? You bet, it's that important. Now is a time when you might have a college intern on for the summer to help in the field. How are you going to brief him or her on being safe? "Don't trip and try and stay out of trouble?" Not very encouraging words. Hiking through the woods or crossing the road with friends is quite different than working all day in those woods or in and along a busy road.

As a Surveyor, you've probably learned ways to be safe in the field over a number of years. Can you remember when you first worked in the field? I hope you conduct yourself in a much safer manner now. Consider making a field health and

safety guide to give to new workers. This doesn't need to be a thick book, but listing common sense items of concern is a good way to make field workers aware of the hazards they'll encounter *before* they encounter them. That advanced information might make the difference between avoiding an incident and a trip to the urgicare or emergency room.

Safe workers are good for your company's bottom line. You want field workers to be productive daily, but it'd be hard to produce when they are not 100% healthy or not physically capable of performing the field task. I've mentioned this next item several times in the *Cleveland Surveying News*. Utility companies and construction contractors budget the time and equipment in order to perform their work in a safe manner - for their workers *and* the general public. When's the last time you saw a utility worker open a manhole by himself and take inventory of what's inside? I honestly have never seen that, but Surveying companies do it.

I'd love to hear your comments on field safety. Have a *safe* and productive Summer.


