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PRESIDENTS LETTER

Greetings fellow PLSO members, from your returning president. Most of you may not remember 25 years ago (1994) when I first served as president. We're still an educational organization supporting and promoting the interests and welfare of the surveying community. Continuing education wasn't required to maintain licensure back then and CPD hours didn't exist. Now, the seminars we've always had have become more important to those of us who need to keep up with the state requirements. In addition, our Chapter has undertaken the task of providing invaluable survey data to our members on the PLSO.info website. 25 years ago, scanning was in its infancy and far too expensive and unrefined to use for such a project as we've embarked upon. The data there has saved my butt more than once! Long story short...our membership has become more valuable than ever since 25 years ago.

GNSS Update — Robert Hoy, Arcadis. U.S.

Available Satellites

3/2018

It's been a busy year for the emerging satellite constellations. The last time I was actively monitoring visible satellites was a year ago when observing pin locations for sending to Trimble CenterPoint RTX Post-Processing, which uses all the satellite constellations - and is free to use. I was typically able to track 4 Galileo and 1 BeiDou satellites, while sometimes tracking 6 and 2 satellites respectively. Fast forward to March 2019 and available satellite count has grown! Here's a list for March 2018 and 2019 using www.gnssplanning.com



We've gained 20 satellites in just the past year! Galileo is nearly at full strength with 22 of their planned 24 satellites, with 3 units also planned to be in orbit as backups in case a satellite is deemed to be unhealthy needs to be turned off for corrections. Galileo's mission statement was to have their constellation at full strength by the year 2020 and they seem to be on track to meet that.



What can these additional satellites do for your surveying? Let's look at the DOP (dilution of precision) chart relative to number of satellites, from www.gnssplanning.com

First we're looking at using a receiver able to track only GPS and GLONASS satellites. This is a chart from 6am to 6pm in Ohio for 3/11/2019. The peak PDOP at 5:30pm is 1.95. With these two constellations we average about 15 satellites, but remember: this is without plotting obstructions such as trees and buildings of which will decrease the satellite count being tracked and increasing your PDOP respectively. Our PDOP looks to be an average of about 1.4. The lower the PDOP the better!



Now we've turned on the Galileo and Bei-Dou constellations and we're averaging about 28 satellites tracked up from 15, or nearly doubling the count tracked! You can think of this as Galileo and BeiDou being full fledged constellations.

The PDOP looks to average about 1.05 which is outstanding! The same 5:30pm PDOP here is 1.28 which was 1.95 with just GPS and GLONASS. Note on the chart page of the planning website, you

can click on the different DOP names to turn them off like I have and their names become grey as I have circled in red here.

You might think "These PDOPs are real low even without Galileo or BeiDou". But remember that these charts are without obstructions, which would simulate a wide open field on a hill without other taller hills, or ideal conditions. I don't know about your projects, but my site locations are rarely ideal.

This GNSS planning website I'm referring to is a great tool to at least see when you should *avoid* using GNSS if you can help it when there are tall peaks in PDOP. These are times when satellite geometry is poor, such as satellites being very near each other and not well spaced out in the sky. The website works great on a mobile phone, so you can see when the PDOP peaks will be that day when you arrive to your site.

Civil 3D for Surveyors - Fundamentals

April 13, 2019

The purpose of this class is to familiarize the attendees with the function and operation of Autodesk's AutoCAD Civil 3D. At the end of this class you should know the following:

- 1) Civil 3D interface and function,
- 2) Transparent and other commands that are purposefully used for Civil 3D rather than AutoCAD,
- 3) How to import data collector points to develop linework and surfaces, and
- 4) Field collection techniques to optimize your base mapping efforts.

A fundamental understanding of AutoCAD is recommended to fully benefit from the training in this course.

I	Acquiring the software: Owning Civil 3D, AEC Collection, purchase options, VAR's, installation and shared use.
II	The Civil 3D Interface: Menu Browser, Application Menu, Quick Access Toolbar, InfoCenter, Ribbon, Tooltips, Transparent Commands, Drawing Window, Command Line, Status Bar, Toolspace. etc
ш	Starting: Templates, Coordinate systems, Workspaces, tabs on the Toolspace and their purpose for Surveying efforts.
IV	Points: Description Keys, Point Styles, Point Label Styles, point elevations and the use of DIST comman
V	Surfaces: Creation, manipulation, breaking old habits, TIN tweaking, boundaries. Comparing surfaces volume calculations.
VI	Bearings & Distances: Drawing lines from bearings and distances, labeling lines, advanced label styles for offsets and crows feet, labels for objects that aren't there, etc
VII	Survey Database: Importing points, converting FBKs, generating linework, automatic breaklines, etc
VIII	Field Collection: Workflows, commands and general field techniques to benefit automatic linework and surface creation.
IX	GIS/LIDAR Information: (Time Permitting) Ohio and its Counties have a wealth of information that can benefit your efforts for base mapping. We will review a handful of them and bring them into our drawings. If we run out of time for this topic, I will provide links to where you can download step by step processes to accomplish them.

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
