

## President's Message

## Office of President-Elect

I have been a PLSO member for twenty years now, for more than half my life (and I'm not yet 40). When I attended The Ohio State University, I was an officer with their PLSO chapter. For the Cleveland Chapter I was Secretary 1997, 1998, 2007, Delegate 2005, Trustee 2003-2004, and 2008-2011. The longer I've been active as an officer, the more I've enjoyed and the "deeper" I've gotten into PLSO and all it entails. We need officers with experience that know and understand our chapter and PLSO, yet we also need new officers to bring fresh perspectives and ideas. As with anything, the more you put into something the more you get out of it too.

For our chapter the office of President-Elect is a three year term being followed serving as President and Past-President. #### Chapter Membership





## **Cleveland Chapter's Delegate Report**

Presented by Thomas M. Snezek, Chapter Delegate

\*The report included herein is offered only as informational to the members of the Cleveland Chapter. The reader is deferred to the approved minutes of the P.L.S.O. for any clarifications\*

Call to order at 6:09 PM, Friday April 13, 2012, Columbus State University in, Columbus Ohio.

- Devotions and Pledge of Allegiance
- A Quorum was established.
- Two new agenda items added.
- Minutes of March 9<sup>th</sup> meeting reviewed and motion passed to accept.
- Treasurer's Report accepted subject to audit.
- State of Rhode Island's "Society of Professional Land Surveyors" submitted letter to our association to petition support for a change of the Model Law to remove "Engineering Surveys" from the NCEES Chapter 110.20 definitions. Each chapter is being asked to review and comment for the April meeting. It will be available for review on the Member's Section of the State Web-site. Motion passed to have Director Gilpin draft letter to the State Board reflecting our stand.
- After discussion of the new member's registration benefits plan, a motion was passed to accept as amended. The issue deals with payment in full of annual dues or at least two payments into the approved payment plan before a registrant can receive the "Member Rate" on the Fall Seminars or any other P.L.S.O. sponsored CPD event.
- Director Gilpin discussed the P.L.S.O. General and Managerial corporate liability insurance coverage.
   After discussion, a motion was passed to have Director Gilpin conduct a review and present any revisions to the executive board. She anticipates that the premiums will go down.
- Director Gilpin introduced the concept of having various documents useful to the member surveyor on the "Members Only" section of the web-page. Examples such as; Contract documents, disclaimers, certification language, etc. After discussion it was determined to not provide this service. It was thought that there may be some liability on the P.L.S.O. and that each Surveyor or Survey Firm should and will determine their needs on their own.
- The White paper from the State Board regarding Tax Map operations is nearly complete and we look forward to a draft for review at the next meeting.
- Taking a paper test for the S.I. or P.S. exam will end with the October 2013 test date. After that all test will be taken digitally.
- P.A.C. balance stands at \$3,193.85 as of April 1st, 2012.
- The Standards committee is requesting examples of easement language. They're looking for bad ones you may have encountered and good ones that you would recommend. Please email them to Brad Kramer. The committee is hoping to draft standards to address the ever growing problems caused by bad easement language and poor agency policies across the state.
- The sad demise of the A.C.S.M. is nearing its end. The N.S.P.S. has absorbed the \$200,000± debt that came with the remains of A.C.S.M. The good news is that the other two agencies that had an interest in this have declined to join N.S.P.S. and they have agreed to give up any interest they may have had in A.C.S.M.
- Status reports were given on the up-coming Fall Seminars and Annual Conferences over the next few years and all are moving along well. Go to the State website for more details.
- John Dailey is working on the "History of the P.L.S.O." and would appreciate any old documentation, histories or stories that you may have. He intends to develop (Cont'd on Page 11)

## **Random Lines**

#### 1862: An Interesting Year

We are commemorating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the American Civil War from 2011 to 2015. Most of this remembrance will concentrate of the war itself, a bloody conflict that killed about 620,000 Americans. To put that number in perspective, that would be the entire population of Cleveland, Parma, Lakewood, Euclid and Cleveland Heights **combined**..

In early 1862, the Confederacy had raised the sunken Union ship, the "Merrimac", re-christened her the "Virginia" and set about refitting her with an iron clad upper works. At the same time, the Union Navy set about looking for an iron clad warship. A Swedish inventor named Ericsson designed and built a very unorthodox looking iron clad called the "Monitor" in only 100 days. It was referred to as "a tin can on a shingle." On March 8, the "Virginia", still called the "Merrimac" wreaked havoc on the Union ships "Cumberland" and "Congress." During the nighttime hours, the Union ship "Monitor" arrived on the scene and the table was set for the very first battle of the iron clads. The shores were lined with the curious as they watched the fight . The ships battled ineffectually for a couple of hours until the battle ended as a draw. But what the crowd witnessed had changed the world. The day

of the wooden warship had ended.

During May 1862 the Civil War saw activity on many fronts. The Union Army had just taken the city of New Orleans. After the battle of Shiloh the Union Army advanced very slowly but finally reached Corinth, Mississippi, which was abandoned by the Confeder-

ate forces. In Virginia's Shenandoah Valley, Confederate General Stonewall Jackson won several victories.

Several of May of 1862's events had long lasting effects on the United States that had nothing to do with the war. On May 15, the Department of Agriculture was authorized by Congress. On May 20<sup>th</sup>, President Abraham Lincoln signed into law the Homestead Act. This act made land available directly from the Federal government for very little cost to persons over 21 years of age "who had never borne arms against the United States Government or given aid or comfort to its enemies" 160 acre plots of federal land in the west for settlement. By the end of the Civil War 15,000 land claims had been made.

There were problems to be worked out, such as how to get the land surveyed and sold in a reasonable (Cont'd on Page 16)

amount of time. Under the existing method, it could take over a year for the paper work to be handled, a survey contracted for, the work to be done, the survey to be filed and the fees to be paid. (See, the Federal Government has not changed that much.)

Another act, The Morrill Act, was first proposed in 1857 and was passed in 1859 but was vetoed by President James Buchanan. It was passed again 1861 (aided by the secession of the Southern states that did not support it) to establish "Land Grant Colleges." President Lincoln signed the bill on July 2, 1861. The purpose of the land-grant colleges was: "without excluding other scientific and classical studies and including military tactic, to teach such branches of learning as are related to agriculture and the mechanic arts, in such manner as the legislatures of the States may respectively prescribe, in order to promote the liberal and practical education of the industrial classes in the several pursuits and professions in life."

In Ohio, there was fierce competition between Ohio University, the first school of higher learning West of the Appalachian Mountains and Miami University in Oxford to receive this distinction and the funding that went with it. The State Legislature, in all its wisdom, chose a piece of farmland just north of Columbus to establish the Ohio Agricultural and Mechanical College. This, of course, morphed into The Ohio State University. The story of OSU and its growth is for another column, but it is fascinating.

The war ground on for another three years across many blood soaked fields, but 1862 helped to open the American West. No longer was the Federal Government selling huge plots of land to speculators, they were now dealing directly with the individual people. Now there was a chance for students to receive an education without traveling to the East coast. Now there were going to be colleges in their home states. Now there was a department to aid and assist the farmers, the largest demographic in the nation.

Sometime in the future we will talk about Ohio State University and its funding and about the transcontinental railroads and how the carried out the dream of America's "Manifest Destiny."


