

President's Message

Working outside as we Surveyors do, comes with hazards. Surveying isn't a safe profession. I've worked with a range of different people in the field from 30 year field veterans to college students being in the field for the first time. What I've realized is working in a safe manner usually does not come naturally. We need to work safely.

Back when I was working in the summer during college I once tried to set a nail on the double yellow line on a 2 lane 35 MPH road while wearing a yellow t-shirt without any safety cones - alone! I have also recently come across a survey crew leaving the cover off a manhole on the centerline of a busy 2 lane road while they were on the tree lawn without their vehicle in the road blocking traffic from driving

near the manhole. An old 18 inch cone placed 5 feet on each side of the manhole was all that warned drivers of a hazard in the road. I'm sure we could all add incidents of near misses with traffic or falls with most time being fortunate to get away without major injury.

Safety for Surveyors needs to of prime importance for field workers. Contractors and utility companies put a lot of time and money into safety training and equipment. You might argue that those industries have higher rates than Surveyors. Surveyors should have rates that account for proper safety practices, equipment, and training. Safety is good for the bottom line. Remember from Jim Smith's session at the 2011 PLSO Annual Conference, a safe worker (and happy worker) is more productive.

Be safe out there this Summer and leave the field hazards and contaminants in the field.

Heroes and Monuments

Recently, Jack Hoy brought to my attention a newspaper article about former Chapter Treasurer Henry (Hank) Papilli. Hank worked for the Cuyahoga County Engineer for many years and was a charter member of the Cleveland Chapter. He may have been our longest serving Treasurer. It was always fun to work with Hank because he always had a story.

Hank was honored by the nation of France for his service during World War II. He was presented the Legion of Honor, the highest honor in France. Henry entered the Army in 1943, landed in Normandy and was severely wounded during the Battle of the Hedgerows. For you younger people, go look at a history of the European campaign. The hedgerows were very dense patches of intertwined bushes that marked road lines, boundary lines and just about everything else in western France. They made a formidable and natural defense for the Germans trying to stop the Ally's advance. A lot of people were wounded or killed breaking through those hedgerows. Hank was one of the luck ones, he was wounded but he came home.

Hank is now 92 years old. He was a dedicated public servant and was always dedicated to his profession and to the Cleveland Chapter. Thank you, Hank, for your service to our country and to our profession.

On another issue, there is a movement afoot to "modernize" Cleveland's Public Square. The City wants to make the Square more people friendly and usable. The landscape architects showed some very nice renderings of what the Square could look like and how it could be used. After looking at the Square, it could use some updating.

One very obvious omission, at least to me as a Surveyor, was any mention about the City's founder Moses Cleaveland. His beautiful bronze statue has stood in the southwest quadrant in front of the Terminal Tower and the Renaissance Hotel since 1898. I always felt comfortable knowing that Moses was watching over the center of our city with a Surveyor's compass cradled in his arm and a Jacob's staff in his hand. It just gave me a sense of continuity.

It would be a shame to see Moses's statue put on

wheels and moved all over as has happened to other statues of Cleveland heroes. The statue of Tom L. Johnson, reform minded Mayor of Cleveland in the early 20th century currently stands in a courtyard at the Western Reserve Historical Society. Oliver Hazard Perry, victor of the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812 had his statue moved so often that they almost put wheels on it.

Perry started off in the middle of Public Square. He was moved to the southeast quadrant only to be displaced by the Soldiers and Sailors Monument. He was again moved to a small lake at Wade Park, only to be displaced again by the Cleveland Museum of Art. He was moved again to Gordon Park where he overlooked Lake Erie. By this time the original statue had deteriorated badly, so two bronze replicas were cast. One was sold to the State of Rhode Island and the other went to Gordon Park. I am not sure where that one is right now. The original went to Perrysburg, Ohio.

The Cleveland Public Square was set out as property to be held in trust for the people of "New Connecticut.". I certainly hope that the "powers that be" remember that fact. It is not "theirs," It is ours. This proposed plan should be open for a great deal of public discussion before the plans are finalized and the first spade of dirt is turned.

I believe that this profession and this Chapter should dedicate itself to the protection of the Moses Cleaveland monument on Cleveland's Public Square. In this modern age, it is far too easy to forget where we came from and who we should thank for laying the groundwork for us. We all stand on the shoulders of those who went before us and they should be honored, not cast out and forgotten in some warehouse.

On another note, Seth Pease, Chief Astronomer and Surveyor on the first survey party and the chief surveyor of the second died of dysentery in 1819 and was buried in Philadelphia. I will be going there and will attempt to find his "new" grave since he was moved in the 1830's. Do you see a pattern here with heroes?




