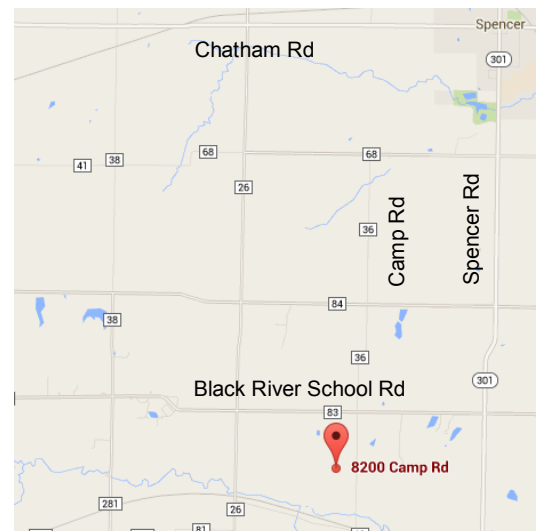

ARE WE "DUMBING DOWN?"

Technology has given us many gifts, among them dozens of new ways to grab our attention. It's hard to talk to a friend without your cell phone going off at least once. Odds are high you will check your Twitter feed or Facebook wall while reading this article. Just try to type a memo at work without having an e-mail pop up that ruins your train of thought. But what constitutes distraction? Does the mere possibility that a phone call or e-mail will soon arrive to drain your brain power? And does distraction matter? Do interruptions make us dumber? Quite a bit, according to research by Carnegie Mellon University Human-Computer Interaction Lab.

Multitasking is a misnomer. In most situations, the person juggling e-mail, text messaging, Facebook, normal work and a meeting is really doing something called rapid toggling between tasks, and is engaged in constant context switching. As any economics student knows, switching involves costs. A typical office worker gets only 11 minutes between interruptions, while it takes an average of 25

Surveyor Spotlight - John "Bill" Welsh, PS

What year did you become a surveyor?

Started surveying in 1958, Licensed OH Prof. Surveyor in 1976

What company do you work for, how long?

Owner of Welsch's Cleveland Surveys, Inc.

Currently, 5 employees, at our peak 44 employees with 23 being a normal size for my firm.

What lead you into the surveying profession? Why?

I started in 1958 after answering an ad in the newspaper for \$0.89 an hour – "outside work will train". The company was owned by Ray Buddie, Earl Peerson, Charlie Betalena, Al Hubar.

I was in an orphanage as a young child from 6 -8 years old at Red Feather on Shaker Blvd., and came from humble beginnings and even at one points sleeping in a closet. But my mother was strong and always kept me positive. She said "we were never poor because there is always someone less fortunate than we are". I learned to always value what I have in the world and respect it. When other kids left for dinner, I stayed at the basketball court and kept practicing. We had peanut butter and I was gratefully for that. I attended St. Ed's High School, in which I played Quarterback, and Safety, and was the team captain until I broke my pelvis and lost my scholarship. Even then, adversity never kept me down.

I was in the Army – 4th Armored Division as the only Field Construction surveyor. Stationed in Nuremburg Germany from 1959 – 1962. I received a message from Cleveland Surveys at the end of my service, and I started back directly on the next day after being released. And I have only missed 5 days due to sickness within my entire surveying career.

Who were your mentors?

Ray Buddie, was mentor and also my best friend. He passed 12 years ago.

Have you always surveyed in Ohio? Other states? Or Parts of Ohio?

Ohio only – as far as Youngstown & Put in Bay, I survey only in the areas that I have good knowledge of.

Do you prefer the field or the office better? Why?

75% field work - 25% office. I like the physical work and you also keep your thoughts sharp. Being 75 years old, both are importance for good health.

What surveying instrument & vehicles do you use? Did you have a favorite over the years?

My new Dodge Journey is a great vehicle for survey work and Sokkia instruments work well for us. Started on a great 1" Theodolite, 3 man survey crew, taping, booking, and calculations.

Is there a type of surveying you are interested in but you're not currently doing?

No I'm content with my surveying career, I plan to slow down but not retire.

I am an avid sports and physical activity person. I played for over 33 years of Football, 33 years in Basketball in Lakewood, and 52 years of Softball. At 60, I also won the 18 and over Racquetball Championship at the Athletic Club. My wife and I also have won numerous Dancing competitions.

What item/ classes/ topic would you like added to the Annual PLSO conference classes?

I think that people over the age of 70 should be grandfathered in with the State Board for CPD's. Allow for less CPD hours for them, between 5 -6 total. At a later age in life, it is harder for people to travel and are limited by their available hours, due to night time driving.
